- Disclosure of any ex parte communications by Council members.
- Consideration of applications to intervene as a party, if any. "Request to Intervene/Expert Witness" forms and instructions may be obtained from the recording secretary prior to the scheduled time for consideration of the item.
- Qualification of sworn witnesses who wish to testify as an expert, based on statement of credentials made orally or set forth in application file.
- Swearing of witnesses who wish to give sworn testimony.
- Testimony of City staff witnesses, with cross-examination by applicant and party-interveners, if they request.
- Testimony of applicant and applicant's witnesses, with cross-examination by Council and party-interveners, if they request.
- Testimony of party-interveners and their witnesses, with cross-examination by Council and applicant, if they request.
- Testimony by members of the public who wish to address application. Any individual, not requesting/designated as an intervening party or expert witness may, upon being recognized by the Mayor, present information to the Council, and may be questioned by the Council but is not required to be subject to cross-examination, and need not be sworn in.
- Close of public hearing.
- Council deliberation/vote.

Items identified with a double asterisk (\*\*) are quasi-judicial functions of the City Council other than land use; the Council Members disclose any exparté communications.



#### Ordinance No. 925—AX2021-01; Voluntary Annexation for Julian Exclusa

City Clerk Battista read Ordinance No. 925 by headnote only, as follows:

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF BROOKSVILLE, FLORIDA, ANNEXING BY VOLUNTARY PETITION PURSUANT TO SECTION 171.044, FLORIDA STATUTES, APPROXIMATELY 9.4 ACRES OF REAL PROPERTY LOCATED SOUTH OF JEFFERESON STREET (US HIGHWAY 98) AND WEST OF EMERSON ROAD BEARING HERNANDO COUNTY PROPERTY APPRAISER KEY NUMBER 357562 INTO THE MUNICIPAL BOUNDARIES OF THE CITY OF BROOKSVILLE, FLORIDA; PROVIDING FOR PUBLICATION; PROVIDING FOR FILINGS WITH THE APPROPRIATE GOVERNMENTAL AGENCIES; PROVIDING FOR SEVERABILITY; AND PROVIDING FOR AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

City Planner Gouldman went over the staff report, which is included in its entirety, as follows:

The petition appears to meet all of the requirements of Section 171.044, Florida Statutes, for voluntary annexation into the City of Brooksville. The City Manager therefore recommends

City Council approve the annexation request through Ordinance 925 and schedule a second and final hearing January 4, 2021.

Julian Exclusa requests, through the voluntary annexation process outlined in Chapter 171.044, Florida Statutes, the property identified as Hernando County Property Appraiser Key Number 357562 be annexed into the City of Brooksville. The subject property is approximately 9.4 acres and is located immediately south of Jefferson Street (US Highway 98) and west of Emerson Road.

Staff reviewed the petition relative to the requirements of Chapter 171.044, Florida Statutes, and determined the request meets the voluntary annexation criteria. Specifically, the petition submitted is signed by all property owners of record and is reasonably compact as defined in Chapter 171.031, Florida Statutes. "Compact" means, according to Chapter 171.031(12), "concentration of a piece of property in a single area and precludes any action which would create enclaves, pockets, or finger areas in serpentine patterns."

The parcel is, as required by Chapter 171.044(1), contiguous to the City of Brooksville along 55 percent of the parcel's northern boundary. Chapter 171.031(11) states that "contiguous' means that a substantial part of a boundary of the territory sought to be annexed by a municipality is coterminous with a part of the boundary of the municipality." Chapter 171.031(11) also states that "the separation of the territory sought to be annexed from the annexing municipality by a publicly owned county park; a right-of-way for a highway, road, railroad, canal, or utility; or a body of water, watercourse, or other minor geographical division of a similar nature, running parallel with and between the territory sought to be annexed and the annexing municipality, shall not prevent annexation...."

Finally, Chapter 171.044(5) states that "land shall not be annexed through voluntary annexation when such annexation results in the creation of enclaves." Chapter 171.031(13)(a) defines "enclave" as "any unincorporated improved or developed area that is enclosed within and bounded on all sides by a single municipality." The annexation does not create an enclave.

The parcel has a Hernando County South Brooksville Planned Development District Future Land Use designation as per the adopted Hernando County Comprehensive Plan, and has a Hernando County R1C zoning designation. The property is developed with a single family conventional dwelling and two duplex structures (four dwelling units). If the annexation is approved, the City's Comprehensive Plan Future Land Use Element will require an amendment to reflect the incorporation and an appropriate land use designation that is suitable to the property and consistent with the intended use. Additionally, a zoning amendment will be required to establish a zoning designation that is consistent with the intended use. The petitioner intends to develop the property as a Recreational Vehicle Park.

The voluntary annexation will not impact the City's current operating budget.

The Internal Revenue Code was recently amended by increasing the required minimum distribution age from 70½ to 72 for retirement systems such as the Brooksville Retired Police Officers' Substituted Trust. This ordinance amendment makes the Brooksville ordinance in compliance with the IRS requirements.

# Ordinance No. 924 First Reading of the 5-Year Schedule of Capital Improvements of the City Of Brooksville Comprehensive Plan.

Recommendation: City Manager recommends approval of Ordinance No.924

City Clerk Battista read Ordinance No. 924 by headnote only, as follows:

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF BROOKSVILLE, FLORIDA, AMENDING THE FIVE-YEAR **SCHEDULE OF CAPITAL** IMPROVEMENTS SET FORTH IN TABLE 8-2 OF THE CAPITAL IMPROVEMENTS ELEMENT OF THE CITY OF BROOKSVILLE **PURSUANT** TO **COMPREHENSIVE PLAN PROCEDURES** ESTABLISHED IN SECTION 163.3177(3)(b), FLORIDA STATUTES; PROVIDING SEVERABILITY; REPEALING ALL ORDINANCES IN CONFLICT; AND PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

City Manager Kutney and Community Development Director Anderson presented the item. Mr. Anderson summarized the following staff report:

The City of Brooksville's Capital Improvement Program (CIP) was developed in order to further the City's commitment to the citizens of Brooksville. The six-year CIP addresses the needs of the City through responsible City government and a comprehensive approach that ensures efficient use of public funds.

The CIP is a long range plan that identifies capital projects, provides a planning schedule, and identifies options for financing the plan. The program provides a link between the City's Comprehensive Plan, various master plans, the annual budget, and the six-year financial forecast. This organized approach to planning projects extends beyond the production of a document alone. A centralized CIP is an opportunity to foster cooperation among departments and inform other governmental entities and rating agencies of the City's priorities and future plans. The process of developing a CIP should solidify the support of the citizens of Brooksville and the City's commitment to carrying out these programs. By going beyond the production of a document, the process and development of a long-term capital improvement program can realize the following benefits:

Focus attention on community goals and needs.

Allow for an informed public.

Encourage more efficient program administration.

Identify the most economically sound means of funding projects.

Enhance the City's credit rating.

The development of a capital improvement program is a continual process and, consequently, should be viewed as a work in progress. While this document covers a six-year planning perspective, it is revised every year in order to accommodate new projects, reflect changes in ongoing projects, and extend the program an additional year. The first year of the plan is incorporated into the annual budget, and funds are appropriated through the budget adoption. Improvements identified in subsequent years are approved only on a planning basis and do not receive any appropriation. Cost estimates for years two through six are presented for planning purposes only, and are used in conjunction with the City's long-range financial plan.

The City seeks involvement of various stakeholders during the CIP development process because the City recognizes the invested interest in maintaining Brooksville as a great place to live, work and play. The City considers input from citizens, the City Council and City staff members in the CIP's preparation.

The Capital Improvement Program document is organized by the Department/Division that each project will be housed in. Each summary includes information on existing projects that will carry over into fiscal year 2021, and projects that are anticipated for funding in fiscal years 2021-2026. Due to the nature of capital projects, the life of a project may span across fiscal years. As funds are designated for a project, they are accumulated in the appropriate fund and expended as the project progresses. When the funds are not spent in one year, they remain in the fund balance to be used in the future. This is also referred to as **carryover funds**. As the City refines the annual CIP, these carryover projects will be redefined into areas of contractual obligation, and ongoing projects are re-appropriated in the following year to ensure full project funding.

The six-year Capital Improvement Program for 2021 to 2026 totals **\$23,875,608**. Funding for the CIP projects is derived from various sources, including general fund revenues, sanitation enterprise fund revenues, water & sewer enterprise fund revenues, TIF funding, Local Option Gas tax revenues, and local, state, and federal loan/grant funding. Uses of these funds, which are summarized on the subsequent pages of this document, reflect the City Council's progressive approach to enhance municipal services to the residents and businesses in the Brooksville community.

Community Development Director Anderson thanked Administrative Assistant, Concetta Cook, for her help with the compilation of the document.

In response to Council Member Bailey's question on an additional code enforcement officer, Anderson answered that staff is in the process of seeking to fill that position.

Mayor Brayton commended staff on the CIP book. He referred to page 31, DPW Buildings and Facilities Projects, and questioned the "Russell Street Bridge Rebuild". He noted there was no amount listed for any of the Fiscal Years and Community Development Director Anderson advised that \$15,000 needed to be added.

Mayor Brayton stated that one item he would like to discuss further during the budget meetings is the walkway into City Hall, which he notes is listed for 2024, which he thinks should be considered for the 2022 budget.

Mayor Brayton called attention to page 75, Streets and Drainage Summary, and questioned the Jetter Vac trucks, which Director of Public Works Booth confirmed two trucks were being requested due to cross contamination and other issues. Director of Public Works Booth addressed the price difference between the two.

The Mayor noted that the Good Neighbor Trail water line project on page 85, Water Utilities Projects, is budgeted for the engineering portion.

Mayor Brayton questioned why the "Mitchell Road Crossing" and "Mitchell Road Water Line" on page 85 were not combined and done in the same fiscal period. Anderson stated that the crossing is affecting a resident and needs to be repaired this year. The water line was an oversight and is now included in 2022 year.

DPW Projects Manager Dowler went over the project related to the Good Neighbor Trail and its proposed traversing through Brooksville as part of a 3.5 mile section of a State wide bicycle trail that runs from the west coast to the east coast of Florida. He stated there in the initial phase of this project, it was determined that there are construction conflicts with existing utilities. The main utility conflict is an existing 8-inch water pipe-line that runs along the south side of West Jefferson, and is in the way of possibly, 16 trail stormwater structures along a distance of approximately 2,000 feet. These structures are part of the trail and are designed to minimize flooding, and to convey stormwater away from the trail and roadway. Trail construction is set for late spring in 2022. In June of 2020, City

Cliff Manuel, Coastal Engineering, with whom Council contracted to review D.O.T. plans of the trail for potential utility conflicts, was present. He went over the trail gap project with includes the Good Neighbor Trail and the portion of the trail that connects the Suncoast Trail from Pinellas County to Titusville. He advised that FDOT originally planned to put the gap on the truck bypass and he explained the process that occurred that now has it proposed to come through the Parks system and through the heart of Brooksville. He went over the water and sewer impact and FDOT right of way costs along the south site of Jefferson Street before the trail enters the Park system. He felt that Council should consider asking FDOT, who is making the public improvement, to reimburse some of the costs of relocation of utilities since the improvements affect land owned by the City. He added that if property owners are willing to let the City put improvements in a City owned easement, he felt Council should consider it.

Vice Mayor Battista explained that Cliff Manuel, as a City resident, was instrumental in getting the trail gap to run through the City and he commended Mr. Manuel's efforts.

Council Member Bailey questioned how this trail, which will run through the Park and on Broad St. and Main Street before connecting to the Good Neighbor Trail, will affect parking. Mr. Manuel stated that there have been early discussions with Jeff Rogers, County Administrator, about the possibility of using a portion of the Health Department parking lot on S. Main Street. It would require an access point onto Main Street. Mr. Manuel suggested a City and County interlocal agreement to use those

parking spaces.

Council Member Bell questioned the projected date of when construction would to begin and Mr. Manuel advised would be Spring, 2022 with completion in 2023.

Mayor Brayton advised that the costs of any relocations would need to be looked at in the 2022 budget year.

# Specimen Tree Removal Request—TR 2021-01; Florida Engineering and Environmental Services, Inc. on behalf of Hill/Gray Seven, LLC.

City Planner Gouldman advised that the petitioner, Florida Engineering and Environmental Services, Inc. on behalf of Hill/Gray Seven, LLC., requests City Council's approval to remove certain specimen trees from an approximately 1.4-acre property located at the southwest corner of the intersection of Broad Street (US Highway 41) and Wiscon Road.

The City Planner referenced the agenda memo, which explained that the request is in anticipation of a proposal to construct a 2,285 square-foot fast food restaurant on the subject site. The subject site is moderately wooded with native vegetation and has a stormwater/pond feature that occupies approximately one-third of the property. The developer has retained a Landscape Architect to assist in the preservation of existing trees and vegetation on the property. To this end, more than 25 trees were identified that are 6 inches DBH or greater. Of these, the developer proposes to preserve 8 native existing trees on the parcel, 3 of which are specimen trees that have an average diameter of 21 +/- inches.

The petitioner was present to answer any questions.

#### Motion:

Motion was made by Bell and seconded by Bailey to approve the request, subject to staff's recommendation which contains the following conditions:

- 1. The developer shall (at a minimum) protect all existing trees to be preserved in accordance with the Land Development Code.
- 2. The developer of the property shall employ a professional licensed landscape architect to design and oversee the construction of a tree-root protection system, to better ensure the health and viability of the existing trees to be preserved on the property. Construction plans shall specify planting details, tree & root protection details and maintenance & irrigation details.
- 3. At least 75% of the replacement trees to be planted must be at least 3-inches at their DBH at the time of planting.
- 4. Any trees slated to be preserved that do not survive the first five years from the date that the

project receives a Certificate of Occupancy will be required to be replaced by the developer/property owner.

Motion carried 4-0.

DADE AVE AND LIBERTY ST. IN DOWNTOWN BROOKSVILLE ON FRIDAY FEBRUARY 26 2021 THROUGH SATURDAY FEBRUARY 27, 2021 FROM 5:00PM TO 8:00 PM; PROVIDING FOR SEVERABILITY, CONFLICTS AND AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

**WHEREAS**, the City desires to promote businesses in and to bring visitors to the downtown area; and

**WHEREAS**, the City desires to support the Brooksville Main Street Fancy Flea, which that brings visitors to the City and to the downtown area, and promotes commerce in the downtown area; and

**WHEREAS**, pursuant to the City of Brooksville Code of Ordinances, Section 74-1(b) and Section 74-165(a), the City Council may close streets for downtown events and allow temporary use of the street, sidewalk or right-of-way for the benefit of a public or private event; and

**WHEREAS**, the Brooksville Main Street, the sponsoring organization for the parade, has submitted an application for a right-of-way closure and temporary use permit, contingent upon submission of an appropriate certificate of liability insurance naming the City as an additional insured in an amount appropriate for the event at least 30 days prior to the event; and

**WHEREAS**, the closure of public streets is necessary for the safety of the public attending the event.

# NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF BROOKSVILLE, FLORIDA, AS FOLLOWS:

Cribb Philbeck Weaver Group, Inc. (CPWG) is pleased to present this proposal to provide Professional Surveying and Mapping Services related to the Tom Varn Park Project located within Section 21, Township 22 South, Range 19 East, Hernando County, Florida. We have reviewed the documents provided and acquired preliminary site data.

The proposal is based on the following conditions and assumptions:

- Horizontal control will be relative to the Florida State Plane Coordinate System, North American Datum of 1983, 2011 adjustment. Vertical control will be relative to the North American Vertical Datum of 1988 as established using GPS.
- 2. The limits of topographic survey will be the existing playground area of Tom Varn Park located north of Darby Lane. The total acreage is approximately 0.63 Acres more or less. See Survey Exhibit "A" for more information.

Based on this information and the information provided as part of this project, we propose the following scope of services:

#### **SCOPE OF SERVICES:**

# **Survey Task 1: Topographic Survey**

A topographic survey will be performed to locate the horizontal and vertical spatial relationship of the above ground man made or natural features lying within the limits defined above sufficient to establish a one-foot contour digital terrain model. Accessible drainage structures, gravity sewer lines and associated pipes will be located and detailed. A note will be included on the survey for any structures that are not able to be detailed. A minimum of two site benchmarks will be established

### CITY MANAGER RECOMMENDATION:

### REPORT IN BRIEF:

On Novermber 02, 2020 City Council approved the awarding of Bid No. RFP-PM-220-2020 to Goodwin Brothers Construction in the amount of \$303,061.89. The contract was for the milling & and resurfacing of 5 road segments and the complete reconstruction of an additional 7 road segments. The FY2020 CIP Milling/Resurfacing Program was budgeted for a total of \$600,000.00. This resulted in a fund balance of \$296,938.11. Staff is recommending that this fund balance be utilized for the complete reconstruction of Forest Ave. and Moline St.. Forest Ave. is approximately 670' long by 20' wide and is in very poor condition. This is a result of age, water line replacement and construction activities that have taken place in the past few years. Moline St is approximately 1300' long by 20' wide. Moline St is also in very poor condition and has deteriated to the point that most of the asplalt layer is no longe present. The cost of the complete reconstruction of these two roads will be \$200,115.00. Therefore, staff is recommending that the available fund balance be utilized for the reconstruction of Forest Ave. and Moline St.

### **DISCUSSION:**

### FISCAL IMPACT:

A total fiscal impact of \$200,115.00 will be funded from the remaining balance of funds available in the FY 2020 CIP Milling / Resurfacing program, project number 019-03

### **ALTERNATIVES:**

Do not reconstruct Moline St and Forest Ave. and apply the available fund balance to other streets in the City of Brooksville.

### CITY MANAGER RECOMMENDATION:

It is recommended that the City Council members approve the creation of a City of Brooksville Building Division under the leadership of the Community Development Department

### REPORT IN BRIEF:

Community Development is proposing the addition of (3) new staff members to create an internal Building Division that will handle all building inspections and permitting for City of Brooksville residents.

### **DISCUSSION:**

The City of Brooksville is no longer using the services of PDCS, LLC, the provider of building inspections and permitting for the City. Due to this change, the Community Development Department is proposing the creation of a Building Division, consisting of (3) FTEs

as follows:1) Building Official, Pay Grade 597 2) Permit Technician, Pay Grade: 582, 3) Building Inspector, 585.

The salary cost of hiring these 3 new staff members to form an internal Building Division will be offset by revenue generated by permit fees collected by the City.

### **FISCAL IMPACT:**

The Fiscal impact of this proposal will be the cost of (3) FTE salaries to include:

Building Official (Starting Salary- \$88,129.60+ \$28,600 Benefit Cost)

Building Inspector (Starting Salary-\$57,636.80 + \$21,207 Benefit Cost)

Permit Technician (Starting Salary \$33,550.40 + \$15,367 Benefit Cost)

Total expected salary expenditure for the addition of the Building Division Personnel: \$244,490.80

### **ALTERNATIVES:**

Due to the fact that PDCS, LLC is no longer providing services to the City of Brooksville for permitting and building inspection needs, creating an internal Building Department is the most feasible option to best serve the citizens of Brooksville. There is no alternative that will adequately meet the needs of the citizens.

**General Description:** Technical work in inspecting building construction, alteration, and repair to enforce compliance with adopted building codes.

### **ESSENTIAL JOB FUNCTIONS:**

Inspects all building construction to ensure compliance with codes and regulations. Makes final inspection of building against approved plans to ensure compliance. Performs records maintenance, clerical work, and activity reports. Issues verbal and written instructions to contractors and other interested parties to correct building violations. Performs related work as required.

### KNOWLEDGE, SKILLS AND ABILITIES:

- Knowledge of the materials and methods used in general building construction.
- Knowledge of the building trade and of stages of construction when possible defects and violations may most easily be observed and corrected.





Unfortunately, each time the Florida Legislature meets in Tallahassee, some state legislators try to overrule decisions made by the local officials you voted for.

# JOIN OUR MISSION TO PROTECT YOUR HOMETOWN section One

We are reaching out to you because some state legislators are joining together and making decisions that take Home Rule away from you and your local city officials.

### This is a big problem.

Home Rule gives your city the flexibility to craft its laws specifically to the unique needs of residents like you.

Because those decisions are being made miles and miles away in Tallahassee and not in your city hall down the street, you have no or very limited say in what they do.

Some state legislators treat all 411 Florida cities the same when they make laws. Even if legislators are making those decisions with good intentions, their proposals are one-size-fits-all when Florida cities certainly are not. Law enforcement in Miami is quite different than it is in Monticello. The highway needs of Orlando are vastly different than the road needs in Panama City. A coastal city like Key West has different stormwater needs than an inland city like Mount Dora.

If you want to promote an idea or don't like a decision that is being made in your city, you can call your mayor or meet with a member of your city council. You can provide public comment during a city council meeting to express your opinion.

In the pages ahead, we will share examples to help you understand which issues are state and which are local.

Will you help tell state legislators to focus on state issues and allow local officials and residents to make decisions that are best for our communities?

# **KEY MESSAGE:**

The state shouldn't meddle in local issues like parking ordinances and neighborhood design. That's the responsibility of local officials who live in my city. Stick with statewide issues!

### A CLOSER LOOK AT HOME RULE Section I Wo

# Many people haven't heard of the term "Home Rule."

Home Rule means that decisions that affect your city are made at "home" in city hall. They are made by your local elected city officials with your input and the input of other city residents. Home Rule is important because it means that decisions for your city are made by the people who love it enough to call it home. They are committed to its success.

Home Rule is not new. It is the law because more than 50 years ago, Floridians voted to include it in the Florida Constitution. It gives each city the flexibility to create its laws specifically to its own unique needs as long as the law doesn't conflict with state or federal laws.

We respect Home Rule because local governments understand the specific needs of their communities. This is why Home Rule matters so much.

# **KEY MESSAGE:**

Home Rule is supported by an overwhelming majority of Florida residents. It is the foundation for local governments as they create fair, effective and responsive policies for their communities.

Home Rule is important because it means that decisions for your city are made by the people who love it enough to call it home. They are committed to its success.

If a city wants to install a stoplight, add a traffic sign, build a holding pond to prevent flooding or hold a parade, it doesn't need to ask the state Legislature for permission. As long as it doesn't violate state law, cities have the flexibility and independence to serve their residents' needs and preferences. We trust our local leaders to enforce laws "at home" and to make necessary decisions as a city grows or changes.

We encourage you to let your state legislators know what really matters to you. When those concerns involve local issues, advise them to leave it to local officials – the people you elected specifically for this purpose!

# **ABOUT FLORIDA CITIES + LAYERS OF GOVERNMENT** Section Four

### Florida Cities

Cities (municipalities) are corporations that were created by their residents. The process starts as a grassroots effort that is not easy nor quick. City founders banded together for a common purpose. A common goal. A shared vision.

Most often, a city is created because its founders wanted an unavailable service or wanted services at increased levels, and they wanted local control of how they were being governed. Cities and services go hand in hand. City services include water, wastewater, stormwater utilities, police, fire prevention and EMS, road building and maintenance, parks and recreation and more.

The services a city provides are determined by the desires and needs of residents through community engagement and input.

### Layers of Government

Florida became a state in 1845. It is made up of 67 counties – the oldest created in 1821 and the newest in 1925. A county is a sub-state, or arm of the state, and every inch of Florida is within a county. Counties provide state services. They are constitutionally created, and the boundaries can be changed only by the Legislature.

The services that a county must provide are law enforcement and jail administration, tax collection, property appraisal, state court administration and supervision of elections. In addition, counties are charged with road maintenance, public health, solid waste disposal and other environmental responsibilities.

### DID YOU KNOW?

Florida has 67 other units of local government: school districts. These constitutionally created districts share the same geographical boundaries as each county, but the school district is a separate government.

In the State of Florida, no matter where you reside, you live in a county and a school district. That is not the case with city government. More than half of Florida residents choose to live in a city. That's because cities are a great place to live, work and play.

Cities are created and designed by their residents, for their residents. They are the only voluntary level of local government in the Sunshine State. Cities require choice on the part of their residents, and with that choice comes the benefit of grassroots democracy, true self-governance and Home Rule powers.

# KEY MESSAGE:

I moved into my city because it was the best fit for me and family. Local officials understand this as they live here too. State politicians who live elsewhere should not be overriding what is important to us.

# **EXAMPLES OF LEGISLATION THAT HURTS YOUR HOMETOWN**

There are two major threats to cities and taxpayers.

One is the state politicians saying they should be in charge of what happens locally. (This is called a **preemption**.)

Another is state politicians requiring cities to do something that's going to cost money, but they don't provide any money to pay for it. (This is an **unfunded mandate**.) In this case, the city must either raise taxes or cut services to pay for it.

State lawmakers meeting in Tallahassee shouldn't tell us how to spend our own local tax dollars.

In the last three years alone, more than 100 bills were filed that would have preempted local control over local decisions. Our residents have helped stop many preemption bills from passing by contacting their state legislators and sharing how the bills would impact them.

Here are some real examples of what happens in the state Capitol in Tallahassee:

A bill that would have stopped cities from determining the appropriate location of short-term rentals. You could have a party house next door, and your city would not be able to stop it. Unruly behavior and issues with parking and public safety destroy the look and feel of our neighborhoods. Many of these rental homes are owned by out-of-state corporations.

While residents suffer and property values plummet, these corporations profit. And you don't know who's staying in those "mini-hotels."

- Legislators passed a bill that allows big telecom to profit from taxpayer-owned land. It gives big telecom the green light to stick their equipment, some as large as a kitchen refrigerator, along your street and in front of your house whether you want it or not. Cities have minimal authority to control where the equipment is placed. Do these companies care about your quality of life or the aesthetics of your neighborhood? Plus, they pay next to nothing for using your sidewalks and street corners.
- Another bill that legislators fought hard for (but thankfully didn't pass) would have put the state in charge of regulating home-based businesses. Can you imagine if there was a commercial auto repair shop in your neighbor's garage? What if your backyard overlooked a home-based junkyard business?
- standards. The bill would have significantly affected the standards. The bill would have significantly affected the ability of a city to preserve the character of its traditional neighborhoods. City design standards ensure that new homes being built in these neighborhoods fit with the character of the neighborhood. Why would legislators living in another area of the state want to decide how your city should look? Isn't that something your local city officials should do with the input of the residents who live in the city?

Sadly, sometimes the forward-thinking policies of past legislators get trampled by those who follow them.

Back in 1992, the Sadowski Affordable Housing Act was created to be used only for funding affordable housing in the state.

The act is funded from doc stamps when property in Florida is bought and sold. It is not funded by the Legislature. A great law with great promise for our residents most in need. Unfortunately, it was not long before state politicians began using affordable housing funds for other purposes. Year after year, when they can't balance their own state government budget, they take money earmarked for the needy instead of curbing their own spending.

# **KEY MESSAGE:**

Most voters say local rules should govern short-term rentals. Nearly 3 out of 4 want local elected officials in charge.

# These actions must stop.

Integrity Florida is a nonpartisan, nonprofit research institute.

In a special report on preemptions published in early 2020, Integrity Florida noted some key findings that show the flagrant use of preemptions by the Florida Legislature. A few of the key finding are:

- Home Rule powers granted to municipalities and counties do not protect local governments against aggressive preemption of their actions.
- Aggressive use of preemptions has many negative consequences. Preemptions interfere with residents' ability to determine the direction of their communities.
- Business-funded corporate interest groups are using their considerable political influence, gained through campaign contributions and lobbying expenditures, to push preemption legislation in the Florida Legislature.


